Please allow me to introduce myself. I am Morgan Wasikonis, the Development and Community Relations Coordinator for Housing Transitions (HTI). I accepted this position six months ago and am still learning so much about the organization, but what amazes me is how much I am still learning about Centre County and its residents.

I have been a local for over 25 years, during which I have been a student, a university employee, and a parent. I thought I knew Happy Valley pretty well, and I like it! What I have seen though, is a whole other side to the area that I didn't really know before. I have seen people in need, and I realize that they are often hidden in our community. I have also seen gratitude, fortitude, and resolve amidst these people, who number more than I expected.

I met a woman who came to Centre House, our emergency shelter, not knowing she had cancer when she walked through our doors. While staying at the shelter, and then in one of our bridge housing units, she has received treatment and undergone a bone marrow transplant. She is continuing to fight her health challenges but her strength and spirit of generosity are felt in her presence. She's the kind of person who would insist you have her scarf, or pin, if you told her you admired it.

Recently I caught a glimpse of the excitement and nervousness of a young couple as they prepared to sign paperwork to move into a bridge housing unit. They had been at the shelter for a couple of months and this was the first time they had signed a lease together. It was inspiring to know that while working with our staff, they had overcome obstacles and were ready for this step.

Stories like these are written everyday at HTI, and I am amazed that each time I walk through the doors of the office, there are new faces needing our programs. I also see the generosity of members of our community daily. Receiving in kind, and financial donations from many people throughout the year helps us to continue offering our programs and, perhaps more importantly, helps those in need of our services feel like they have a strong foundation of support. Many of you strengthened our base by contributing at year end. Thank you!
