Program Updates



Coordinated Entry Access Site

Housing Transitions was recently approved to be a Coordinated Entry System Access Site and we are thrilled! This means that individuals and families experiencing homelessness can contact us directly, rather than calling the 2-1-1 system, to be connected to services. We will complete the same assessment with the household, either in person, or over the phone, that determines eligibility for a variety of housing related human services, shelters, and housing programs in the state. We feel it is very important to be able to offer this service. The assessment is long, asks personal questions, and can take more than a half hour to complete. In addition, the wait times to get through to a housing specialist can be prohibitive. Now, people in Centre County can call our direct line at (814) 237-4865 or schedule a time to come talk with us about their housing crisis.
